The Delaware River system

The Delaware River system is composed of the East Branch, West Branch, and Main Stem of the Delaware River. The entire system is influenced by cold water releases from two large New York City reservoirs, the Pepacton and Canonsville dams. These dams produce one of the top tail water trout fisheries East of the Rockies. The cold water produces heavy insect hatches supporting a trophy trout population. This combination attracts fishermen from all over the country. The fishing is rarely easy here, but anglers have the opportunity to catch wild fish famous for their strength and fighting ability. Students will get to fish various areas in the Delaware system and hone their skills on some of the most selective trout found anywhere.
